Rockbridge County Public Schools (RCPS) has two students at Central Elementary School who tested positive for the COVID-19 virus today. After contact tracing, it was determined that 11 students are required to quarantine. RCPS continues to work closely with the Virginia Department of Health during the contact tracing process.

As defined by the VDH, a person classified as being exposed must have been in contact within 6 feet of a positive case, with or without a mask, for a total of fifteen minutes within a 24-hour period. A person who is in the same building as the positive case do not need to quarantine unless advised to do so by the VDH. Due to State and Federal laws related to privacy, RCPS cannot identify or confirm the identity of individuals who test positive or who quarantine. RCPS continues to recommend all individuals self-monitor for symptoms and remain home when feeling ill.

RCPS continues to recommend that individuals wear face coverings while in public, maintain appropriate social distance, and wash their hands thoroughly and frequently. The Health Department will contact those individuals exposed to a positive case, determines if they meet criteria of a close contact, and if so, instructs them of their requirement to quarantine for 14 days following their most recent exposure to a case. This process is designed to identify all close contacts of a case, whether household, community, work, church, etc. to aid in containment of virus spread.

RCPS will continue to provide clear and concise information to the affected school community and will communicate as much information as possible to ensure public health safety while maintaining personal privacy.
